- 1) We have audited the accompanying statement of audited Consolidated financial results of the R R Financial Consultants Limited ('The Holding Company') and its subsidiaries (collectively referred to as 'the Group') for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2020 ('the statement') attached herewith, being submitted by the Holding company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ('Listing Regulations').

 - iii) Gives a true and fair view in conformity with the aforesaid Accounting Standards and other accounting principles generally accepted in India of the consolidated net profit and other financial information of the Company for the year ended March 31, 2020.
 - **3) Basis for opinion** We conducted our audit in accordance with the standards on Auditing ("SAs ") specified under section 143 (10) of the companies Act, 2013 ("the Act "). Our responsibilities under that standard are further described in the "Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Consolidated Annual Financial Results section of



our report ". We are independent of the Group in accordance with the 'Code of Ethics 'issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India ("the ICAI") together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our Audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the Rules there under, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence obtained by us and other auditors in terms of their report referred in "Other Matter "section below, is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

4) Management's Responsibilities for the Consolidated Financial Results -The Statement has been prepared on the basis of the consolidated annual financial statements. The Holding Company's Board of Directors are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the statement that give a true and fair of the net profit and other comprehensive income and other financial information of the Group in accordance with the applicable Indian Accounting Standards (IND AS) prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 (The 'Act'), read with relevant rules issued there under, and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 of the listing Regulations. The respective Board of Directors of the Companies included in the Group are responsible for maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the Group for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and the design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the respective financial results that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, which have been used for the purpose of preparation of the consolidated Financial Results by the Directors of the Holding Company, as aforesaid.

In preparing the Consolidated Financial Results, the respective Board of Directors of the Companies included in the Group are responsible for assessing the ability of the Group to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the respective Board of Directors either intends to liquidate their respective entities or to ease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The respective Board of Directors of the Companies included in the Group are responsible of overseeing the financial reporting process of the Group.

5) Auditors Responsibilities for the Audit of the Consolidated Financial Results-

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the Statement as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is high level of assurance but is not guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of this statement.

As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

• Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the Statement, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.



- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. Under Section 143 (3)(i) of the Act, we are also responsible for expressing our opinion on whether the company has adequate internal financial controls with reference to financial statements in place and operating effectiveness of such controls.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by the Board of Directors.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of the Management and Board of Directors use of the going concern basis of accounting and based on the audit evidence obtained, whether material uncertainty exits related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the ability of the group to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exits, we are required to draw attention in our auditors 's report to the related disclosures in the statement or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Group to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the Statement, including the disclosures and whether the Statement represents the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.
- Obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence regarding the financial results of the entities within the Group to express an opinion on the statement. We are responsible for direction, supervision and performance of the audit of financial information of such entities included in the statement of which we are the independent auditors. For the other entities included in the Consolidated financial results, which have been audited by other auditors, such other auditors remain responsible for the direction, supervision and performance of the audits carried out by them. We remain solely responsible for our audit opinion.

We communicate with those charged with governance of the Holding Company and such other entities included in the statement of which we are the independent auditors, regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal controls that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

Other Matters

We did not audit the financial statements of 15 subsidiaries included in the consolidated financial statements, whose financial statements reflect total assets of ₹ 6572.48 lacs as at 31 March, 2020; as well as the total revenues of ₹1593.66 lacs and net profit after tax ₹ 18.21 lacs as at 31 March, 2020. These financial statements and other financial information have been audited by other auditors whose report has been furnished to us, and our opinion on the Statements, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in the statements is based solely on the report of such other auditors and the procedures performed by us as stated under Auditor's Responsibilities section above.

Our report on the statement is not modified in respect of the above matters With respect to our reliance on the work done and reports of the other auditors and financial statements certified by the Management.



 Attention is drawn to the fact that the figures for the quarter ended 31st March 2020 and the corresponding quarter ended in the previous year, as reported in these consolidated financial results, are the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published year to date figures up to the end of third quarter of the relevant financial year. Also, the figures up to the end of the third quarter had been reviewed and not subjected to audit. Our report is not modified in respect of this matter.

The statutory Auditors have carried out the "Audit" of the ABOVE Financial results, who has expressed an unmodified opinion thereon

The Above results has been prepared in compliance with recognition and measurment principles of companies (Indian Accounting standards) Rules, 2015 (Ind AS), prescribed under section 133 of company Act, 2013 and other recognised accounting practices and policies to the extent applicable.

Previous year figures have been regrouped and rearranged wherever considered necessary. The entire operation of the company relates to only one reportable segment, therefore segment reporting by Ind AS 108 is not required.

The Group has assessed the possible effects that may result from the pandemic relating to COVID-19 on the Carrying amount of Plant & Equipments, Receivables, inventories, Investments and other assets/ liabilities. In developing the assumptions relating to the possible future uncertainties in the global economic conditions because of this pandemic, the Group, as at the date of approval of these financial results has used internal and external sources of information. Presently, the Group has concluded that the impact of COVID-19 is not material based on those estimates. Due to the nature of the pandemic, the Group will continue monitor developments to identify significant uncertainties in future periods, if any.

The figure for the quarter ended 31st march 2020 are balancing figures between audited figures in respect of full financial year ended 31st march 2020and the published year to date figures upto the third quarter ended on 31 december 2019.

1 **Opinion**
